

Visiting Fellowships Laureate Program in Global Corporations and International Law, 2023-2027

A limited number of Visiting Fellowships are available annually for researchers to participate in the Laureate Program in Global Corporations and International Law at Melbourne Law School at the University of Melbourne. Visiting Fellows will be integrated into the Program, attend weekly reading groups, research meetings, and work in progress seminars. They will have the opportunity to workshop a draft and receive feedback from the team on their own work and to receive mentoring during their visit. They will have a workspace, library access, and will not be required to pay any visitors fees. They will be able to access other events at Melbourne Law School and the University.

Application Criteria

The fellowships are primarily intended for early to mid-career scholars. In exceptional cases, applications from PhD candidates and senior scholars will be considered.

Visit Dates

Visiting Fellowships may be taken up for a period of one to three months during periods not substantially including or beginning in January or July.

Application Close Dates

<u>For visits from Feb - June 2025</u>, applications will be considered on a rolling basis between 23 July and 31 August 2024.

<u>For visits from August - November 2025</u>, applications are due on 8 March 2024. Applicants will be notified by the end of March 2025.

Funding

Visiting Fellows may be wholly self-funded or offered up to \$2500 AU toward the cost of travel and accommodation in Melbourne. Applicants who do not require funding will receive the same title and privileges and may be able to visit for a shorter or longer duration. Applicants will be responsible for securing and funding their own visas.

- A covering letter explaining your current research, its relationship to the Laureate Program, and why you would like to visit our Program.
- Your curriculum vitae (underline your last name) (max 10 pages).
- If you are wholly self-funded or require financial support provide details.
- The proposed dates of the visit.
- The name and contact details of two referees who have agreed to be contacted directly by us.

Conditions of Award

Visiting Fellows will be expected to participate fully in the Program during their visit. They will be asked to write a short statement reporting on their visit within one month of the visit and may be asked to participate in a video interview about their work for the Program media.
